Your net price is a college's tuition and fees minus grants, scholarships and education tax benefits you receive. It's a discount of your college costs that you do not have to pay back. For example, the average published price of in-state tuition and fees at a four-year public college is \$9,139, but the average net price — what the average family really pays — is just \$3,030.
